Business Meeting (6:30 pm):

Membership – Lorrie P.

- We had a total of 8 **renewals** over the same period 3 in December and 5 in January. Thank you to everyone who renewed their membership. We're glad to have you with us.
- We had 1 **expired** membership in December.



- This brings us to a total of 105 memberships, which includes 7 group memberships, giving us a total of 112 members.
- We are very pleased to announce the approval of the first two Certified Habitats by National Wild Ones within our chapter.
- Kevin K.'s habitat was certified on 12/10/24.
- Angela G. earned the second certified habitat on 1/19/25.

Jane noted that Jan 27th is third anniversary of start of SCPA WildOnes Chapter – started as a Seedling.

Treasurer – Margaret N.

- Check from last year's Diakon plan sale came in.
- 2024 financial account all reconciled.
- No real expenditures except for \$100 to Kevin Kelly for talk.
- Sold 48 pairs of gloves \$240 raised (\$248 was cost for 12 dozen gloves)
- Talked about how to provide receipts when selling gloves. Do we need to get any
 information from people in order to provide receipt for purchases based on guidance
 from National. Margaret to get more details.
- Question regarding sales tax. Wendy had investigated no sales tax because is considered clothing.
- \$3280.65 current balance + Diakon deposit will be \$4903.40
- Jane asked Margaret if we still had outstanding financial report to close out on WildOnes site. Appears one still needs to be reconciled.
- Main Street sponsors (WildOnes initiative) try to get business sponsors. We have not pursued that yet.

Report on Social Media and Google Docs progress – Jane A.

Introductions and Query of the Month: What plants have you successfully grown from seed? By planting via milk jugs, in pots, or straight into the ground? And where did you procure your seeds?

Jane A described two methods for winter sowing:

- 1. Sow in wet sand, put into refrigerator, take out in March. After germinate, pot up and grow under lights
- 2. Sow in milk jugs, leave outside

Lorrie P. discussed upcoming <u>Great Backyard Bird Count</u>. Birding event that is sponsored by Cornell Lab of Ornithology – a Citizen Scientist project. Takes place Feb 14th-17th. Report birds you see (same area every day – backyard, part, etc.). Report (using e-bird). There is a free live event on how to participate – offered on Feb 6th and Feb 12th <u>Register for Great Backyard Bird Count Webinar</u>. Lorrie will post on WildOnes ListServe.



Lorrie also described Audubon's "Birds and Coffee" at the indoor bird viewing area at the Olewine Nature Center at Wildwood Park, the second Saturday of each month from 10-11 a.m. November through April. Appalachian Audubon members are there to help you learn to identify the birds at the feeders as part of "Project FeederWatch," another citizen science project sponsored by Cornell. Appalachian Audubon and Dauphin County Parks and Rec. cohost this event and serve free cups of Audubon's organic, bird-friendly coffee, as well as tea and hot cocoa to participants.
